Aim of the Course: Achieving the knowledge on contemporary political theories				
Outcome of the Course: This course is devoted to analyzing of modern and contemporary political theories in an in-debth way. It encompasses main themes and conceptions of the contemporary European political and legal thought. There are considered all relevant theoretical traditions and ideological perspectives, including the most recent ones, which have been developed under an influence of globalization, postmodernism and contemporay development of the culture of human rights - feminist and environmental political and legal theory, contemporary republican political theory and theory of civil society, and theory of multiculturalism.				
CONTENT of the course: LIBERAL POLITICAL THOUGHT (classicasl liberalism, egalitaria liberalism, libertarianism, neoliberalism; CONSERVATIVE POLITICAL THOUGHT (traditional organic conservatism, demochristian political tradition, individualist (libertarian)conservatism, neoconservatism and "new right"); SOCIALIST POLITICAL THOUGHT (anarchism - centralč topics,, marxism - crucial conceptions, communism - linlisiinism and staljinism), socialdemocratic conceptions and the welfare state; THEORIES OF DEMOCRACY (classical liberal-democratic theories, classical theories of direct democracy, contemporary theories of democracy; ELITIST THEORIES (Conservative theories of elites, liberal-democratic theories of elites, critical theory of elites); TOTALITARIANISM (main themes and conceptions - nacism, fashism, staljinism, theories of totalitarianism); THEORES OF JUSTICE (J. Rawls, R. Dworkin, J. Raz, Ch. Scanlon, A. Sen; FEMINIST THEORY (radical feminism, liberal feminism, socialist feminism); MULTICULTURALISM (Sh. Benhabib, Ch. Teylor, W. Kymlicka; THEORIES OF GLOBALIZATION; THEORY OF CIVIL SOCIETY; POSTMODERN POLITICAL THEORIES; CONTEMPORAY REPUBLICANISM.
