Requirements: Regular attendance. The course will be delivered in the Summer semester. Lectures will be interactive and students will have to prepare themselves for each class.			
Aims of the course: The course aims for the student to deepen and widen the knowledge in the field of European Union Law.			
Course result: Students should be able to acquire of knowledge and skill sufficient for critical observance a very broad spectre of European Union Law and to perform independent original research.			
Course content: Europe and the European Union; The European Communities; From the Treaty of Paris to the Lisbon Treaty; Establishment of the European Union; The nature of the Union law: Supremacy, direct applicability, exclusivity and pre-emption; EU Institutions and Institutional Framework: the Commission, the Council, the European Council, the European Parliament, the Court of Justice of the European Union. Other Institutional and Union Advisory Bodies: the European Court of Auditors, the European Central Bank and the European System of Central Banks, the European Economic and Social Committee, the Committee of the Regions; The EU judicial order: Court of Justice of the European Union, General Court, European Union Civil Service Tribunal. Functions of the Preliminary Reference Procedure; Union Law-making: Union legislative procedure, National parliaments and representative democracy, Comitology; Sources and effects of EU Law: Primary EU law; Sources of secondary EU law, Secondary EU law: Regulations; Secondary EU law: Directives. Secondary law and direct effect; Supremacy - EU and national perspective; conferral, subsidiarity and proportionality; The Four Freedoms: The Internal Market: Introduction, purpose of the Internal Market, Legal framework of the Internal Market, Free movement of goods, Free movement of workers, Free movement of services; Direct effect of directives, Secondary law and direct effect; State liability for damages in case of breach of EU law, Citizenship of the Union: Introduction, Evolution and nature of Union citizenship, Right to move and reside within the Union, Political rights of Union citizens; Fundamental Rights in the EU: Fundamental rights, Jurisprudence of the Court of Justice of the EU; Introduction to EU Competition Policy and Law; Enforcement of Union Law.
