- IV. EUROPEAN ADMINISTRATIVE SPACE (EAS): The principles of EAS; The implementation of the EAS concept in European Integration processes.
- V. THE COUNCIL OF EUROPE AND EU ADMINISTRATIVE LAW: Recommendations from the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe regarding the administrative procedure, judicial and non-judicial legal protection against unlawful administrative acts, enforcement of administrative and judicial decisions, etc.; European Court of Human Rights standards in the area of administrative law.
