<b>Course content:</b> <b>I. INTRODUCTION TO INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS LAW</b> - concept, subject-matter, method, Relations with other branches of law, The importance of IBL , historical development, legal sources, unification and harmonization, <i>Lex mercatoria</i> . <b>II.FOREIGN TRADE LAW</b> - basic institutes of customs law, non-tariff barriers, import export types, trade remedies (antidumping, countervailing, safeguards), economic integrations, World Trade Organization rules and principles, EU foreign trade policy. <b>III. INTERNATIONAL CONTRACTS</b> - COMMERCIAL TRANSACTIONS: uniform law of international sales - the CISG, scope of application, rules of interpretation and gap filling, general rules, conclusion of contracts, obligations of sellers and buyers, non-conformity of goods, legal remedies, exclusion of liability, other rules, limitation period, INCOTERMS, countertrade, franchising contracts, agency contracts, distributorship contracts, FINANCING OF TRADE: letters of credit, bank guarantees, factoring, forfeiting, financial leasing, OTHER CONTRACTS: international construction contracts, e-trade. <b>IV.
