| Course result: Understanding of the appearance and characteristics of the ownership in the Roman Law, as well as the other <i>iura in re</i> . Enabling the candidate to the independent research in the field of <i>iura in re</i> in the different historical periods in the Roman and other legal systems. | | | |
| Course content: The course content in the first line two origins of the Roman ownership: <i>legis actio in rem</i> and techniques of the territorial organisation and system of organized colonisation and public assignment of the land. The second part of the curse is dedicated to the changes of the concepts and the system of <i>iura in re</i> during postclassical period. The last part of the course consists of the comparative analysis, analysis of the influence of the Roman to medieval and pandectistic thought, as well as the modern dilemmas about the ownership to the extent of their connection to the Roman Law. | | | |
