Additionally, the objective of the course is to develop the candidate's ability conduct an independent scientific analysis, to apply research methods and to form stances and develop appropriate argumentation in this field.			
<b>Course result:</b> Candidates should acquire knowledge and skills that would enable them to approach the complex questions concerning the public administration in a critical manner, and to conduct independent research in this area.
