Aims of the course: Development of the ability for the critical approach to the sources and literature, enwidening the knowledge of the Roman law contribution and its significance for the modern time, development of the research skills in the field of legal and social phenomena.

Course result: Achieving the scope of the knowledge and the skills enabling the candidate to independently critically think of the course subject.

Course content: The course contains the historical overview of the development of the Roman legislation, from the earliest period to the postclassical legislative activity of the emperors. The analysis of the origin and the meaning of the term *lex* is emphasized, as well as the forming role of the people within the different types of the assemblies. There is also a comparative analysis of the legislation regulation of the private law relations between Romans and other antique peoples and, on the other hand, the role of the legislation in modern European legal systems.
