## **Requirements:**

**Aims of the course:** Providing students who have opted for work in the judiciary, law office, the police, social services, penitentiary / correctional institutions, etc. to supplement and deepen the knowledge they acquire by studying basic criminal disciplinary disciplines, to see them in the light of their criminal-political function.

**Course result:** Evaluation of solutions from our legislation in practice, with emphasis on contemporary trends in suppressing certain forms of crime, emphasizing which comparative solutions can and should be implemented in our regulations and practice.

**Course content:** The course includes an in-depth study of crime prevention policy, familiarization with the development of crime prevention policy and the basic characteristics of crime suppression. Special attention is devoted to the study of the following entities:

1. Historical development of crime prevention policy; 2. The narrower and broader concept of criminal policy; 3. Criminal and societal aspects of crime prevention policy; 4. Principles to be implemented in all segments of crime prevention policies and obligations arising from international conventions and other international documents.
