Aims of the course: The course shall enable students to deepen their knowledge of local government law.			
Course result: Acquiring knowledge and skills that enable an independent and critical thinking concerning local government law as well as an independent original research.			
Course content: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The course has several parts: theoretical part, comparative, historical and positive law review of local government regulation. • Introduction (theoretical part) – consideration of key institutions of local government: concept, characteristics, origin, legal, social and territorial ground, position, organization, institutions, jurisdictions, types and forms, financing and legal protection of local government. Comparative, historical and positive law analysis of local government regulation relies on the concept and structure of the basic institutions which are previously mentioned. • Comparative law review – local government in developed and transition countries. • Historical background – the evolution of local government in Serbia in two periods, from 1946–1990, and from 1990–2007. • Central (positive law review) – introducing the regulation of the local government system in the Republic of Serbia, based on Constitution (2006) and on Local Government Law (2007).
