## Aims of the course:

- **II. Administration in the separation of powers system** (Administration and the Legislature. Administration and the Judiciary. Legality and legitimacy of administrative action);
- III. **Administrative Law as a legal discipline** (Broad concept of the subject matter of Administrative Law. Narrow concept of the subject matter of Administrative Law. Administrative law and social regulation).
- IV. **The Administrative act** (Notion and types of acts of the administration. Types and features of administrative acts).
- V. **Principles of administrative procedure** (General and special administrative procedures);
- VI. Control of the administration (Administrative dispute. The Ombudsman);
- VII. E-Government (E-Administration).
