Course title: CRIMINOLOGY WITH PENAL SANCTIONS EXECUTION LAW

Requirements:

Aims of the course: In-depth study of criminological methodology, dynamics and forms of crime, exploration of the factors of criminal behavior, both individual and social, study of victimization issues as well as issues in the field of international regulations and practice of international courts on the rights of prisoners.

Course result: Mastering the methodological apparatus and its practical application in crime research, acquiring knowledge about the phenomenology and etiology of crime, understanding victimological aspects of criminal phenomenon, acquiring knowledge in the field of penal sanctions execution law, a comparison of legal solutions to their application in practice and with accepted international standards in this area.

Course content: 1.Methodology of crime research, 1.1.Basic terms of the methodology 1.2. Scientific research of crime: important characteristics, data types, the research process, methods and case studies, methods and theories, ethics of scientific research, 1.3. Categorization of research methods on crime: categorizations represented in the literature; according to the access type to the subject; historical and comparative research strategy; strategy of forecasting; evaluative strategies, 1.4. Methods for gathering and processing data: the method for studying individual cases, the method of medium size, the use of statistics in criminology, 1.5. The triangulation method, 2.Phenomenological dimensions of criminal phenomenon: the state of crime in the world; structure and the tendency of crime in the Republic of Serbia; typology of crimes and perpetrators; violent, property, political and crime in transport, 3. Etiological dimension of criminal phenomenon: approaches to causality; criminogenic factors external and individual; 4. Victimological dimensions: types of victims; forms of victimization; some categories of victims; "crimes without victims", 5. Penal sanctions execution law as a science, 5.1. The subject of the penal sanctions execution law, 5.2. Method of the penal sanctions execution law, 5.3. The position of the penal sanctions execution law in the system of sciences, 6. International sources of the penal sanctions execution law, 6.1. The categorization of international sources 6.2. The most important primary sources - history and essential characteristics, 6.3. United Nations documents, 6.4. Documents of the regional organizations - the Council of Europe, 6.5. Jurisprudence as a source of the penal sanctions execution law, 7. Practical aspects of the execution of the prison sentence, 8. The report of the Ombudsman.
