Aims of the course:

The aim of the course is to analyze, from all aspects, the protection against domestic violence as a new family law legal concept in the Family Act, to gain aplicable knowledge of the legislative profile of the domestic violence institute (the dominant family-legal aspect, but also other relevant aspects of the analysis). Beside positive aspect of the analysis, an adequate holistic approach to thistorical-legal aspect of domestic violence, as well as its modern variations will be applied.

Course result:

The acquired knowledge should be of such quantum and quality as to precisely determine all relevant elements: the qualities and shortcomings in the legislative formulation, the social, family, gender and intimate dimensions, up on which applies the legal mechanism and, also, records and results that have been achieved in the applying legal concept of protection against domestic violence. Students will acquire knowledges of greater quality and quantity, adequate for proper implementation of family law regulations and their critical analysis. Each student will strive to autonomously, with the teachers' assistance, record his special preferences to certain aspects of the analysis of this modern phenomenon and to motivate students for theoretical and practical analysis of domestic violence subjects.

Course content:

Evidence of the domestic violence causes, analysis of their actions and specificities, the legal and philosophical basis of the protection against domestic violence. Complex analysis of specific acts of domestic violence (advantages and disadvantages of provisions provided in the Family Act of Serbia and also in the comparative legislation. Protection measures against domestic violence (analysis of the list of mesures their legal and social meaning. Analysis of the procedure for protection against domestic violence (general characteristics). Legal, social, family, and individual purposefulness of the application of this institute Achieved or expected success in the elimination of causes and consequences of this social / family pathology. Records regarding success of applying domestic violence regulations.
