<b>Requirements: /</b>			
<b>Aims of the course:</b> The course aims to enable students to acquire knowledge and to understand basic principles and aims of human rights from the perspective of constitutional law.			
<b>Course result:</b> Students will acquire knowledge and skills enabling them to critically think about a wide range of questions pertaining to human rights, as well as to conduct an autonomous research which shall result with an original master thesis.			
<b>Course content:</b> The course shall provide more detailed analysis of human rights institutes. Two aspects of the internal (constitutional) aspect of human rights will be studied: general (notion and subject matter, legal sources, improvement and control of human rights, monitoring the implementation of human rights as well as the types of this supervision and activities of the entities involved in the supervision procedure); and, particular (fundamental human rights which are enshrined in the international instruments and which are incorporated, or should be, in the Serbian legal system).
