Aims of the Course: The aim of the course is to familiarize students with the basic forms of international legal assistance and cooperation in criminal matters, both in order to combat crime in general, and especially in relation to its most serious forms, such as organized crime and terrorism.			
Course result: Understanding the basic mechanisms of international legal assistance and cooperation in criminal matters; Understanding the role of different actors in the proceeding of international legal assistance; Understanding different forms of international legal assistance and cooperation; getting familiar with legal terminology in the field of international legal assistance and cooperation; Developing practical legal skills through writing legal acts in the field of international legal assistance and cooperation; Developing critical thinking and analytical approach to issues of international legal assistance and cooperation.			
Course content: The course has two parts. The first explains the general concepts of international cooperation and legal assistance in criminal matters, while the second part analyzes the basic mechanisms of the criminal justice system of Serbia in relation to international legal assistance, as well as legal sources that apply in this area.
