Aims of the course

Exposition of problems related to law and justice as well as discussion about these problems in a studium generale manner, meaning that students attending lectures perpetually broaden their legal horizons not only with legal knowledge but also with non-dogmatic knowledge on justice: historical, sociological, philosophical, psychological, cultural, comparative as well as knowledge from other related fields.

Course result

Students develop the abilities of critical thinking and recognizing main conceptions of justice in legal theory and practice - in legislation and practical jurisprudence; they develop the ability to rationally discuss abstract concepts and their import on the organization and functioning of a political community.

Course content

Diverse subjects related to law and justice, encompassing but not limited to: current pressing issues; important historical cases; strictly legal topics; ethical, psychological, as well as interdisciplinary topics including economic, bioethical, political, literary topics and topics from other relevant disciplines; theoretical, philosophical and practical legal issues related to legislation and practical jurisprudence; national, foreign, international topics from all legal domains, all branches of law and connected to various legal institutes.
