Requirements:

Aims of the course: The main purpose of the coure is to provide students with basic overall knowledge of Private International Law (hereinafter:PIL) and allow them to apply PIL concepts in practice. Focus of lectures is on cricitcal re-evaluation of existing domestic and international rules and codifictions, while all disputable issues are treated within the context of international harmonization of decision making (as one of the funding principles of PIL). Apart from domestic laws and regulations, body of international rules (more specifically international conventions that Republic of Serbia is a State party to) is also examined in the course of a semester with a particular emphasis on EU PIL rules.

Course result: Student should attain basic overall knowledge of Private International Law and a skill to apply the knowledge in future practice.

Course content:

III CIVIL PROCEEDINGS WITH A FOREIGN ELEMENT (International Jurisdiction; Lis Pendens Rules, Foreigners before Domestic Courts; International Legal Aid in Civil Matters; Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Judgments; Immunity);

IV RIGHTS OF ALIENS (General Introduction; Foregin Investors' Rights; IP and related issues);
