Aims of the course: The aim of the course is to provide students with basic knowledge of Civil Law, and a more detailed knowlegde of the Property Law, as one of the parts of Civil Law. The aim is setting a good foundation for understanding and mastering a large number of courses throughout the studies. The General Part of the Civil Law should provide for a basic knowledge of this legal branch, as well as a more detailed research of some of the basic notions and institutes of Civil Law, which are common to many different parts of the Civil Law. Property law gives students knowledge on a number of legal insitutes, most importantly of ownership, but also rights of easement, real estate securities, the construction, land registration and possession.
Course result: Students learn to analyze the existing solutions of national law, as well as to adequatly implement them in practice.
