Aims of the course: The Course provides students a basic theoretical knowledge concerning aims and legal instruments of protection against social risks, along with their training for understanding the system of mandatory social insurance, social assistance and social protection in Republic of Serbia			
Course result: The Course gives the students a chance to learn about the key legal and basic extra judiciary aspects of social security, as well as training for the proper and complete understanding of social law as an instrument of social justice and social cohesion.			
Course content: The contents of the course include the following units: The concept and subject of social law; Need for social security; The concept and the types of social risks; Historical development of protection against the social risks - undifferentiated methods of protection (private assistance, savings, premium insurance, civil law rules on liability for damage); Concepts of protection against social risks (Bismarck and Beveridge model and their combinations); Social insurance; Social security; Social protection (concept and demarcation); Concept, elements and subjects of social legal relationship; Social benefits; Pension and disability insurance; Health insurance; Unemployment insurance; Voluntary insurance against social risks; Social assistance.
