Requirements:			
Aims of the course: Acquiring theoretical and practical knowledge in the field of crime prevention policy.			
Course result: Enabling students to acquire basic theoretical and practical knowledge of the policy of suppressing crime both from the criminal-legal aspect of combating crime and social prevention of crime.			
Course content: The course includes determining the concept and task of the Policy of suppressing crime, as well as learning about the basic characteristics of crime suppression in individual historical stages. Particular emphasis is put on the principles that need to be implemented in all segments of the crime prevention policy, to the obligations that arise from that of international conventions and other international documents. Criminal aspects of the fight against crime and the aspect of social prevention of crime are especially studied. Within each issue, it points to significant theoretical attitudes, their impact on legislative solutions, as well as on problems and non-compliance of legal solutions with practice. Special attention is paid to evaluating solutions from our legislation in practice, with emphasis on contemporary trends in combating certain forms of crime, highlighting which comparative solutions can and should be implemented in our regulations and practice.			
Course content: 1. The concept and task of criminal policy; 2. Principles of criminal policy; 3. Developing criminal political thought; 4. Criminal law aspect of the fight against crime; 5. Social prevention of crime.
